
Rio de Janeiro Fashion Week sets ARJUN BHASIN off on a style quest through the city's chic streets

Something about Brazilian fashion was different this year—it was stronger, bolder, and more eager to impress. Structure, architecture, construction—these were the key words from Fashion Rio 2010, a hilarious irony considering that in Rio, filp-flops are the chic walks and you're more likely to go shopping in a string bikini than a pair of jeans. Still, the collections seemed more geared toward winter in Paris and Milan than the beach-front promenades of Rio. Ultra-slick and super-luxe. the collections covered futuristic looks for high-fashion Barbie (Aquastudio), S&M Lara Croft (Espaco), and Lufthansa's first flight to the moon (Mara Mac). Techno fabric, luxurious black jersey, and leather ruled the catwalks. It was all about Amazonian models, stilettos that look like weapons, guys in panama hats, a caffeine-charged crew of photographers, and a brigade of trendy bookers, makeup artists, and hair personsall things that we've come to know and love about fashion week.


CHRIST ALMIGHTY!
